Subject:- Grant of LoP (Letter of Permission) to The Chairman, Global Educational Trust 103, Asha Apartment 1st, 19 Raja Ram Mohan Rai Marg, Hazratganj, Lucknow- 226001, Uttar Pradesh in respect of the application vide ref. no. MGAMC/24/08/66 dated 31.08.2024 received for seeking permission of the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian system of Medicine, National Commission for Indian System of Medicine to establish a new Ayurvedic Medical college in the name of Mahatma Gandhi Ayurvedic Medical College & Research Centre, Vill - Khasarwara , Post - Banthara Lucknow 226401, Uttar Pradesh (AYU0914) with an intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course from the academic session 2025-26 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 -reg.

Sir/Madam,

- I am to refer to your application/scheme vide ref. no. MGAMC/24/08/66 dated 31.08.2024 received from The Chairman, Global Educational Trust 103, Asha Apartment 1st, 19 Raja Ram Mohan Rai Marg, Hazratganj, Lucknow- 226001, Uttar Pradesh on the subject cited above and to verify the available facilities of teaching and practical training for intake capacity with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course from the academic session 2025-26, the college was visited on 25.09.2025 and 26.09.2025 on hybrid mode for issuance of the letter of intent (LoI) by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) and letter of intent was issued to you vide letter of even no. dated 01.10.2025 to establish a new Ayurveda Medical college in the name Mahatma Gandhi Ayurvedic Medical College & Research Centre, Vill - Khasarwara , Post - Banthara Lucknow 226401, Uttar Pradesh (AYU0914) with an intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course from the academic session 2025-26, under Section 29 of NCISM ACT 2020.
- The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) again carried out an inspection of the institution on 08.10.2025 and 09.10.2025 through Hybrid mode. The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under and as per the Visitor Observation following shortcomings/defects have been observed:-.

1. Teaching staffs:-

a) Shortcoming of teaching staff is as under:-

b) Availability of total teaching staff for 100 seats in UG (BAMS) Course as per the part -1 submitted by the college is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{09}{10} \times 100\% = 90\%$ (Excluding Excess)

2. Functionality of the hospital:-

- a) There were zero deliveries conducted from 1st Jan 2024 to 31st Dec 2024.
3. Thereafter, the assessment report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely the, **"Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024"**, provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under.
 4. Further, it is **decided to issue the Letter of Permission (LOP) in accordance with Regulation 62 (2) of "Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024"** to establish new Ayurveda Medical College with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2025-26 subject to ratification in the ensuing Board Meeting.
 5. Further, in accordance of the regulation **59 (6)** of notified Regulations namely the **"Minimum essential standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Institutions Regulations, 2024, a letter was sent to you** vide letter of even no. dated **15.10.2025** to furnish fixed security deposit worth **Rupees 02 Crore** for a period of five year in favor of National Commission fund for Indian system of Medicine. In response of the same you have furnished the fixed security deposit amount worth **Rupees 02 Crore** in favor of the National Commission fund for Indian system of Medicine through RTGS payment mode vide Ref. No. **ICICR42025101600511738** dated **16.10.2025** and informed the same vide an email dated **16.10.2025**.

"DECISION"

6. Therefore, in accordance with Regulation 63(3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024, Letter of Permission (LoP) is issued to The Chairman, Global Educational Trust 103, Asha Apartment 1st, 19 Raja Ram Mohan Rai Marg, Hazratganj, Lucknow- 226001, Uttar Pradesh to establish a new Ayurvedic Medical college in the name Mahatma Gandhi Ayurvedic Medical College & Research Centre, Vill - Khasarwara , Post - Banthara Lucknow 226401, Uttar Pradesh (AYU0914) with an intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course from the academic session 2025-26, under Section 29 of NCISM ACT 2020 subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcoming and following requirements shall be fulfilled: -
 - I. It is further informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 100 seats** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counselling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
 - II. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
7. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
8. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
9. **Immediately compliance of all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.**
10. **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2025 and compliance report should be submitted to MARBISM in order to be considered for the process of the permission for the academic session 2026-2027 as per rules:**
 - i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
 - ii) All the requirements of minimum standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in MES (Assessment & Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda Colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals) Regulations, 2024.

- iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2022.
- iv) **The shortcoming mentioned in Para no. 2.**
11. The College administration shall ensure that sufficient qualified teachers and non-teaching staff in the college and requisite staff in the hospital, as per the NCISM ACT and relevant regulation thereunder, are in position before the admission of the 1st batch of student in the 1st professional of BAMS is made, under intimation to the Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM.
12. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
13. The college has to develop the requisite infrastructure for I, II and III professionals well in time as per the norms which will be verified by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board and accordingly the permission for taking admissions in subsequent academic session will be considered.
14. The college administration may take up the matter for recognition of the qualification under section 35 of the NCISM Act, 2020 at that time when the first batch of students admitted against this course appears for the first final professional examination of the said course.
15. The fulfillment of the condition given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian system of medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian system of medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission matter for the academic session 2025-26.
